

# PNY FALL CAMPING TRIP – FY07

## November 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>, 2006

1. **Meet** at the Blue Angel Recreation Park (off of Hwy 98) at 1600. We all will meet at the Camp Store and proceed to the Youth area from there. Campout will end at 1400 on Friday, each camper **MUST** help with the closing duties in order to camp with us – no leaving early in order to get out of the clean-up part!! Cost is \$3 for food, and \$1 if you are sleeping in the rented tents. They may charge at the front gate by the vehicle – we don't know that yet – so have a few extra dollars with you just in case.
  
2. **Bring** the following **ALL IN A BACKPACK OR BAG YOU CAN CARRY** with Sleeping Bag and Pillow attached by a bungee cord!!
  - a. Sleeping bag and pillow
  - b. 6 waters (There won't be anything else to drink!!)
  - c. Tennis Shoes – Blue Jeans – Layered Clothing – Rain Poncho – Change of Underwear – Jammies – Mess Kit (Plate, Knife, Fork, Spoon for 2 meals and Drinking Cup for Hot stuff) – Knit hat-gloves – Comfort Buddy if needed
  - d. Flashlight and Batteries
  - e. Toiletries – toothbrush, comb, soap, towelDon't bring games – electronic toys – IPODs or other music devices – we are roughing it!!

## DETAILS

### FOOD PLAN

(Don't bring extra snacks – experience great campfire cooking! – The team is buying the food (with your money) – so make sure you are signed up or we won't have enough!!)

Thursday Night: Cook your own on a stick by the fire  
Pioneer Drumsticks or Foil Stew (Hamburger type meals)  
Cave Woman Cream Puff (Biscuits and jellies)

Friday Morning: Cook in the coals Friday for breakfast  
(we are going on a hike first so we can get the fire down to coals!)  
Eggs 'n Oranges (Scrambled Eggs cooked in an Orange)  
Little Pig Potatoes (Sausage and Roasted Potatoes)

Friday Lunch: Cook on the fire Friday for lunch  
Roasted Apples (Apples stuffed with nuts, raisins, brown sugar, etc),

Hot Dogs for Lunch. (Will also have peanut butter and jelly)

  - a. Thursday: Communal Tent Set-Up, Campfire, Supper Clean-Up
  - b. Friday: Woodsman, Camp Take Down
3. 12 and Older: Everyone is responsible for preparing, cooking and clean up of their own food. Buddy up with a little guy and help them! But also...
  - a. Thursday: Camp design, Table Set-Up and Veggie Prep, Bedding Down Prep and Check
  - b. Friday: CampFire, Breakfast Clean Up
